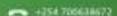

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1. Coffee Industry Performance

1.1. Coffee Exports

1.1.1. Coffee Export by Quantity and Value

he total quantity of coffee exported during the period under review was 5,111 MT representing a 29.8 percent decrease from 7,283 MT exported in the previous year during the same quarter. The quantity exported in October 2023 was the highest at 1,977 MT while December 2023 registered the lowest quantity of coffee exports at 1,549 MT.

The value of coffee exports decreased from USD 40.35 million in October-December 2022 to USD 26.52 million in the period under review. This represents a 34.3 percent drop in value, ascribed to changing markets dynamics. For more details, refer to Table 1.

1.1.2. Coffee Exports by Destination

Belgium, USA, Sweden and Germany were the leading Kenyan coffee exports destinations in the period under review. Cumulatively, the top ten destinations accounted for 4,322 MT valued at USD 22.42 million in October-December 2023 compared to 6,010 MT valued at USD 33.31 million in the similar period in 2022. 1.2. Coffee Imports

Coffee imports in the period under review amounted to 395 MT valued at USD 1.72 million compared to 307 MT valued at USD 1.54 million in the similar period in 2022. The increase in the value of coffee imports by 11.7 percent could be mainly attributed to the weakening of the Kenyan shilling. For more details, refer to Table 3.

2. Sugar Industry Performance

2.1. Sugar Production, Sales and Closing Stocks

uantity of sugar produced in the period under review declined by 52.5 percent to 98,654 MT from 207,802 MT produced in the same period in 2022. During the quarter, December 2023 recorded the highest sugar production at 48,877 MT while October 2023 had the lowest production at 24,597 MT. Low sugar production was ascribed to the prevailing sugarcane shortage.

The total sales made during the period under review was 80,221 MT representing 60.5 percent decrease from 203,161 MT sold during the same period in the previous year. The reduction in total sales can be attributed to the decline in the quantity of sugar produced in the period under review. The closing stock in the factory during the period under review was 21,685 MT compared to 10,472 MT at the end of the same

period last year, an indication of improved availability of sugar in the local market.

2.2. Sugar Imports and Exports

Total sugar imports in the quarter under review stood at 236,929 MT, representing 145 percent increase from 96,588 MT imported during the same period in 2022.

The total quantity of sugar exported in the period under review was 144 MT representing a decrease of 25.5 percent from 114 MT that were exported in 2022 in similar period.

2.3. Sugar Prices

The average ex-factory price of a 50Kg bag of sugar increased from KES 6,528 in 2022 to KES 8,555 in the period under review. In addition, the average wholesale sugar price for a 50Kg bag rose by KES 1,861 to KES 8,788 in 2023. For more details, refer to Table 4 below.

3. Pyrethrum Performance

uring the period under review a total of 5,900 Kgs of pyrethrum products was exported to various destinations which was a drop from 25,850 Kgs exported during the same period in 2022 representing 77.2 percent decrease. For more details, refer to Table 5.

4. Fibre Crops Sector

4.1. Quantity and Value of Sisal Fibre Exports

uring the quarter under review, a total of 5,110 MT of sisal fibre worth KES 1,265,037,995 was exported to various destinations which was a drop from 6,740 MT worth KES 1,487,348,683 exported in the same period in 2022. The decrease in fibre exports could be attributed to delays in shipping companies in the ports of the major export destinations. For more details, refer to Table 8.

4.1.<mark>1. Sisal Price/Kg in KES and Grades</mark>

During the period under review, the average F.O.B price of sisal was KES 249.43 per Kg compared to KES 224.06 per Kg recorded in the same period in 2022, an increase of 11.3 percent. This could be attributed to the market forces of supply and demand experienced in the world market for sisal. For more details, refer to Table 9.

4.1.3. Sisal Exports by Destinations

There was a total of 21 export destinations in the period under review. Nigeria was the leading sisal export destination, with 35.45 percent of all the sisal exported followed by China (13.15 percent), Saudi Arabia (12.15 percent), Morocco (8.74 percent) and Senegal (4.64 percent). 5. Food Crops Performance

5.1. Crop Category Imports by Volume

uring the quarter under review a total of 570,794 MT comprising of maize, wheat, rice, beans and green grams were imported compared to 691,128 MT imported in the same period in 2022 representing a 17.4 percent decrease. The decrease in imports could be attributed to bumper harvests experienced in the country. The major reduction was on rice (78 percent), beans (55 percent) and maize (39 percent). 6.2 Crop Category Exports Volumes (MT)

During the period under review a total of 26,041 MT comprising of maize, wheat, rice, beans, potatoes and green grams were exported compared to 7,732 MT exported in the same period in 2022. Potatoes were the highest exported food by volume at a total of 21,507 MT. For more details, refer to Table 13.

6. Horticultural Crops Performance

6.1. Trade Flows

n the period under review (October-December 2023), the total horticultural exports by value was KES 41 billion and imports recorded were KES 12.13 billion respectively. The total traded value from the two trade flows in the period under review amounted to KES 53.13 billion. However, the horticultural trade flows by volumes for imports were the highest at 107,095 MT compared to the exports recorded at 86,338 MT respectively. For more details, refer to Table 14.

6.2. Crop Category Exports

In October-December 2023, flower exports accounted for 53 percent of the total horticultural export values at KES 21.85 billion while vegetables and fruits accounted for 35 and 7 percent of the total value at KES 14.19 and KES 2.68 billion respectively. For more details, refer to Table 15.

6.3. Horticultural Export Performance by Destinations

In the period under review, there were a total of 152 export destinations. Netherlands was the leading



horticultural exports destination, with a total value of KES 9.58 billion representing a market share of 23.4 percent of the total value of horticultural exports. The top 20 export destinations represented 91.8 percent of the total horticultural exports by value as shown in Table 16 below.
