



4th Quarter e-news Bulletin (April-June 2015)

This is the Second e-news quarterly publication of the Agriculture, Fisheries Food and Authority. It gives insights into how the period (April - June 2015) performed, focusing on the economy, aaricultural performance and commodity price indicators.

Economy

Kenya's budget for the financial year 2015/16 read on the 11th June 2015 by the Cabinet Secretary for the National Treasury, Henry Rotich increased by 17 per cent from 2014/15, to reach slightly over Kshs. 2 Trillion.

During the financial year 2015/16 the government aims to raise revenues worth KSh.1.358 Trillion (whereby more than half of 1.358 will be sourced from salaried employees/workers) for the development of the various sectors of the economy. The fiscal deficit will be financed by external financing of KSh.340.5 billion and domestic financing of KSh.229.7 billion.

The minister further said that the growth of the economy was 5.3 percent in 2014 and is expected to accelerate to between 6.5 - 7 % in 2015, with the same pace continuing in the

medium term.

Key Highlights of the Budget

The sugar industry as well as the local sugarcane farmers will benefit from the budget 2015/16 as sugar importers will pay an extra Kshs. 25 per Kg of the produce. This is expected to increase the current sugarcane price paid to the farmers and make local sugar more competitive. The implication of this unilateral decision is however not clear, considering that Kenya is a member state of the EAC Customs Union and the COMESA Free Trade Area, both of which provide for duty free and quota free access of goods/services originating from partner states.

The state aims to raise Kshs. 25 billion from taxing non-essential commodities such as beer, cigarettes and plastic bags. The increase in taxes levied on plastic bags (a common packaging material in the country), will lead to an increase in various agricultural commodities due to the increase in packaging costs.

Road maintenance levy went up by Ksh.3 per litre of petrol and diesel. This is expected to have adverse effect as Kenya is highly dependent on petroleum and petroleum products hence a slight rise in fuel will have 2 of 12

Other East African Countries Budget;

Uganda

The Uganda's Minister for Finance Matia Kasaija in his budget speech presented to the public a 24 Trillion Uganda Shillings tax heavy Budget for the financial year 2015/2016. This is up from the 2014/2015 financial year budget of 15 trillion Uganda Shillings. Uganda's economy is projected to grow at 5.8 per cent in the financial year, largely attributed to the recovery in private sector consumption, as well as acceleration in both public and private investment.

Tanzania

Tanzania on the other hand slashed its budget by over 20 per cent compared to allocations of the previous year. Tanzania's Finance Minister Saada Mkuya unveiled the Tsh. 22.4 Trillion government budget for the FY 2015/16 which elections scheduled to be done in October 2015, and improving the agricultural sector among other priority areas.


Rwanda

According to New Times of Rwanda, the country's finance minister, Claver Gatete, announced the budget for 2015/16, expected to be Rwf 1.768 trillion, representing a slight increase of Rwf 11.9 billion from the Rwf 1.762 trillion budget for 2014/15 financial year.

The Infrastructure and Agriculture ministries are some of the most important sectors, with the former taking the lion's share of the total national budget, while activities in the latter impact on almost 70 per cent of the country's rural livelihoods.

Agricultural Performance 1. Sugar

A total of 137,035 tonnes of sugar was produced during the period April-June 2015, a drop of 25.7 % from the same period last year. This is attributed to the sharp decline in sugar production in Mumias resulting from low cane supply by farmers as a result of delay in payments for cane delivered.

Also during the quarter, 143,354 tonnes of sugar were sold against the 153,225 tonnes sold in the same period in 2014/15 a drop of 6.4%.

The decline in local sugar sales was as a result of increased availability of imported table sugar into the local market.

Similarly by the end of the fourth quarter total closing stocks of sugar were 10,311 tonnes 49 % below the closing stocks reported in the same period last year. The low closing stock was mainly due to the low sugar bagged during the quarter.

Table 1 below shows the sugar production, sales and closing stocks held by the millers in metric tonnes.

Sugar Exports and Imports

Overall sugar imports for the quarter was 47,735.1 tonnes most of which came in April - 22,249.5 tonnes. White refined sugar imported was 35,755.9 tonnes with the balance being mill/brown sugar.

During the quarter under review, sugar exports totaled to 30.65 tonnes comprising of 2.01 tonnes of mill/brown sugar and 28.64 tonnes of white refined sugar.

Ex-factory, Wholesale and Retail Sugar Prices

During the review period, average ex-factory sugar price for the 50Kg bag was Kshs. 3,755 against Kshs. 3,487 reported in the same period last year, a 7.7% increase.

Wholesale prices took a similar trend to ex-factory prices, with a higher average value in Q4 2015 compared to the same period in 2014 (See Table above). The average quarterly wholesale price hit Kshs. 4,114 being 10.8 per cent higher than that reported in the same period in 2014.

Rebagged, unbranded sugar referred to as "*loose sugar"* retailed at an average of Kshs. 104/Kg which was 2.8% lower than the price reported in the same period last year.

2. Food Crops

Coarse Grains Market Perspectives

This section gives briefs on the coarse grains market trade position by focusing on the imports and exports through the Kenyan border points with Tanzania, Uganda & Ethiopia.

Maize: Total maize imports in the 4th quarter were 249,596.8 MT up 97% from the same period, last year. The largest imports volumes were in May amounting to 162,086.7 MT. There were no maize exports through the border during the quarter compared to 20 MT of maize were exported in Q3.

Sorghum: The country imported a total of 19,228.1 MT of sorghum down 75% from the 77,943.1 MT imported in the previous quarter. Most of the sorghum imports were made in the month of May - 19,080.5 MT. During the quarter, a total of 2,580 MT were exported against 5.4 MT exported during the 3rd quarter.

Wheat: 288,570.5 MT of wheat were imported during the quarter, 14% decrease from the 335,664 MT reported in the previous quarter. Only 8 MT of wheat were imported in April – being the lowest for the entire quarter, while the month of June recorded the highest wheat imports at 149,059 MT. wheat grain imports reported in the 4th quarter.

Beans: 29,576.1 MT were imported into the country in Q4 up from 20,396.8 MT in Q3. The busiest month during the quarter under review was June reporting 10,918.4 MT against 9,055.9 MT reported in March. A total of 10 MT were exported during the quarter.

Millet: During the quarter under review, total millet imports were 2,626.5 MT down 617.5 MT from imports in Q3. Most imports were in June - 1,274.9 MT.

Rice: Kenya is a net rice importer. During the review period, 7,508.4 MT of rice were imported, 5,477.7 MT down from total imports in the previous period.

Selected Food Crop Prices

Dry Maize

During the review period, the average wholesale price of a 90 kg bag of dry maize was Ksh. 2,868 an increase of 17.5% from the price in Q3. Price of dry maize were unstable during both quarters.

Finger Millet

In the quarter, a 90kg bag of Finger fillet sold at an average wholesale price of Kshs. 7,173 4% up from the previous quarter.

Sorghum

The average wholesale price of a 90 kg bag of sorghum was Kshs. 3,846 5% down from Q3.


Beans Canadian

Kshs. 7,357 was the average wholesale price for a 90kg bag of Beans Canadian in the quarter 16% up from Q3.

White Irish Potatoes

The average wholesale price of white Irish potatoes was Kshs. 3,474 an increase of kshs. 887 as compared to the previous quarter. The prices were unstable during both quarters.

3. Tea

A total of 93.5 million kgs of Tea was produced in Q4 2014/15 FY compared to 81.7 million Kgs produced in the previous quarter, a 14% increase. The significant increase in production is attributed to good precipitation experienced in most tea growing zones.

Total exports for the quarter were 90.9 million kgs compared to 119 million Kgs observed in the previous quarter, a decrease 23%. The decrease is attributed to oversupply of tea globally especially from Northern India.

Domestic consumption of Tea declined marginally by 0.6 million kgs from 6.7 million kgs recorded in the previous quarter to 6.1 million kgs recorded in Q4. The decrease is attributed to competition from other beverages mainly preferred by the youth and teenagers. AFFA has embarked on campaign to create awareness on the importance of drinking tea as a health beverage, an initiative expected to reverse the downward trend.



4. Coffee

A total of 6,682 metric tonnes of coffee valued at \$ 21,241,752.56 was bought at the Nairobi Coffee Exchange Auction in Q4 compared to 13,203 metric tonnes, valued at \$61,429,436.04 bought in Q3. This is a 65% drop attributed to inactivity at the Auction in June 2015.


The price of coffee at the auction in Q4 averaged \$3.16 per kg compared to \$4.66 per kg in the previous quarter, a decrease of 32.2%.

5. Horticultural Crops

The Export Market

(a) Cut-Flowers

A total of 29,357.5 MT of cut-flowers valued at Kshs. 11.9 Billion were exported during the quarter down from 34,827.3 MT in Q3.

Most of the flowers 37% of Q4 exports, valued at Kshs. 4.4 Billion were exported in May, while June had the lowest exports of values amounting to Kshs. 2.2 billion.

(b) Fruits

12,080.8 MT of fruits were exported in the 4th quarter against 9,139.2 MT in the previous quarter. The Highest exports were made in the month of June at 4,562.9 MT with May recording the lowest during the quarter at 3,667.3 MT.

Kshs. 1.5 billion was realized during the quarter from fruits exports. Much of this was posted in the month of June grossing Kshs. 557,516,854 accounting for 36 per cent of total export revenues. The month of May realized Kshs. 436,241,202 being 28% of the total export values.

(c)Vegetable

Vegetables exported in the quarter under review amounted to 16,023.5 MT compared to 16,061.1 MT exported in the previous quarter. The month of April recorded the highest export quantities amounting to 6,686 MT.

The quarter reported Kshs. 4.1 billion total export revenues from vegetables. The highest export revenues were realized in May contributing 1.43 billion, which is 35 per cent of the total export revenues realized.

Overall horticultural exports for the quarter under review were 57,461.8MT valued at Kshs. 17.7 billion. The highest revenues were realized from cut-flowers which were valued at a total of 11.97 In addition, total export values from vegetables and fruits were Kshs. 4.14 billion and Kshs. 1.54 billion respectively.

Q4 horticultural export values were lower than in Q3. In Q3 exports were 60,027.6MT valued at Kshs. 24.82 billion which was 29.9% higher than that realized in Q4. Total export value of Cut flowers was Kshs. 19.01 billion in Q3 against Kshs. 11.97 billion realized in Q4, while fruits and vegetables export values for Q3 were Kshs. 1.39 billion and 4.42 billion respectively against Kshs. 1.54 billion and Kshs. 4.14 billion in Q4.

The Horticultural Domestic Market

Cabbage

In the 4th quarter, the average wholesale price of the 126kg bag of cabbage was kshs. 2,596 up by Kshs. 175 from the previous quarter.

Tomatoes

Q4 saw an increase of 23% in the wholesale price of the 64kg Kg box of tomatoes to reach an average of 5,356 from Kshs. 4,352 observed in the 3rd quarter.

Onions Dry

The 13kg net of dry onions was wholesaling at kshs. 1,167 in the 4^{th} quarter, an increase of 33.2% from Q3.

Passion Fruits

The average wholesale price for the 57kg bag of Passion fruits was kshs. 4,510 in the 4^{th} quarter an increase of 11% from the previous quarter.

Oranges

The average wholesale price of the 93kg bag of oranges was Kshs. 3,223 in Q4 an 8.2% drop from the price recorded in Q3. For more details refer to Table 5.



Commodity Prices

(a) Wheat flour

Retail price of 1kg of wheat flour ranged from Kshs.55 - Kshs.95 giving an average of Kshs.67 per kg holding steady from Q3. The 2kg pack was retailing between Kshs.105 - Kshs.170 with an average of Kshs.130 per pack.

Wholesale price of the 24kg bale ranged from Kshs. 1,260 - Kshs. 2,040 giving an average price of Kshs. 1,464 an increase of 6%.

(b) Sugar

Retail price for 1Kg of branded sugar ranged between Kshs. 93 -Kshs. 145 with an average of Kshs. 119, while 1Kg of rebagged unbranded sugar ranged from Kshs. 89 -Kshs. 120 giving an average of Kshs. 99 an increase of Kshs. 8 per kg from Q3.

Wholesale price of the 24kg bale which is mostly packaged for the South Nyanza Sugar Company ranged from Kshs. 2,200 - Kshs. 2,700 with an average price of Kshs. 2,424 while the price of a 20kg bale ranged between Kshs. 1,900 - Kshs. 2,500 with an average of Kshs.2,294, 11% increase from Kshs. 2,061 observed in the previous quarter. Kshs. 4,363, 18% increase from Kshs. 3,691 observed in the previous quarter.

(c) Tea

100g of loosely packed tea was retailing at between Kshs.30 - Kshs.90 depending on the brand giving an average of Kshs.44, a drop of 8% from Kshs. 48 observed in the 3rd quarter. The 100g pack of tagged and taggless tea bags was retailing between Kshs.83 - Kshs. 200 and Kshs. 50 - kshs. 103 giving averages of Kshs. 123 and kshs. 103, respectively. Factory brands in town in teagrowing zones are priced more competitively.

The 10 kgs box of loosely packed tea was wholesaling between Kshs. 3,100 - Kshs. 3,945 giving an average price of Kshs. 3,694, a 4% increase from a mean of Kshs. 3,551 observed in the previous quarter. It was however noted that many wholesalers were selling the loosely packed tea in dozens called Outers.

(d) Coffee

0.1 kg of ground coffee was retailing between Kshs. 48 and Kshs. 176 giving an average of Kshs. 60, a decrease of 9% from Q3. 0.1kg of instant coffee was retailing between Kshs.250 and Kshs.489 giving an average of Kshs. 397 a decrease of Kshs. 2 from Q3.

(e) Maize flour

Retail price of 1kg of maize flour ranged from Kshs. 45 to Kshs. 85 giving an average of Kshs. 55 per kg an increase of 15% from Q3. The 2kg pack was retailing between Kshs. 85 and Kshs. 166 giving an average of Kshs. 112.

Wholesale price of the 24kgs bale ranged from Kshs. 1,010 to Kshs. 1,650 giving an average price of Kshs. 1,176, a 24% increase from Q3.

(f) Rice

1kg of Grade 1 and Grade 2 rice was retailing between Kshs. 90 and Kshs. 240 and Kshs. 79 and Kshs. 185 giving an average of Kshs. 170 and Kshs. 123, respectively.

Wholesale price of the 25 and 50 kgs bags of rice was between Kshs. 1,600 and Kshs. 2,150 and Kshs. 3,000 - Kshs. 4,560 giving an average of kshs. 1,746 and Kshs. 3,743 respectively.
